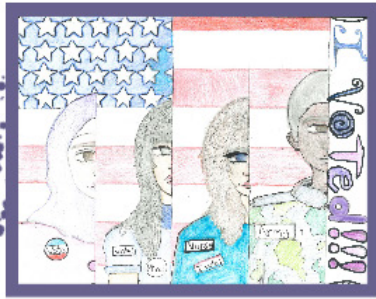
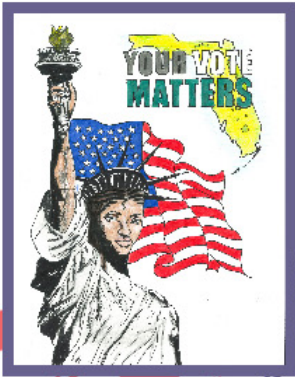


ART FOR DEMOCRACY



2023 Call for Entries

The vision for the “Art for Democracy” contest is to obtain, showcase and judge artwork that expresses what the democratic process means to our student artists in Collier County.

The Supervisor of Elections invites student artists in grades K-12 to submit original artwork with voting and election-centric themes. Students K-8 may also enter an original design for an “I Voted” sticker to be considered for use in the 2024 elections. Twelve winning pieces will be featured in 2024 election-related materials distributed by the Supervisor of Elections office at local outreach and educational events. A monetary donation will be made to the K-8 Art Department of the school who wins “Best of Show,” and a scholarship will be awarded to one high school student for their winning entry. Prizes are presented by Champions For Learning through the Chuck Mohlke Endowment Fund of the Community Foundation of Collier County. Additional monetary prizes will also be awarded by the Naples Chapter of the Florida Society Sons of the American Revolution.

Participants

Participants may be any student within the Collier County Public School System or enrolled in a K-12 private, charter school or home school.

Acceptable forms of art media include, but are not limited to: oils, colored pencils, gouache, acrylics, watercolors, graphite/pencil, pen/ink, photography, graphic design, pastel, tempera, batik, scratchboard and original prints.

Grades K-8

Student artists in grades K-8 may choose to submit artwork in one of two categories:

Category 1: An original, 8.5x11” two-dimensional piece of artwork.

Students in grades K-5 should express the theme of “The history of our government” (Examples: Revolutionary War, the Declaration of Independence, the history of voting rights and amendments).

Students in grades 6-8 should express the theme of “The Voting Process” (Examples: registering to vote, the importance of voting and the three ways you can cast a ballot: Vote-by-Mail, Vote Early or Vote on Election Day).

OR

Category 2: An original design for an “I Voted” sticker, created on the attached template, to be used during the 2024 election cycle. Artwork must include the words “I Voted.”

Grades 9-12

All submissions must be original, 8.5x11” two-dimensional pieces. Artwork previously created is eligible for submission. Artwork submitted in this category will be considered for the high school scholarship and should express one of two themes.

Theme 1: Faces of Democracy (Examples: political figures or individuals praised for their contributions towards voting rights).

Theme 2: Voting Local (Examples: importance of voting in local elections, how a bill becomes law, key figures or issues in your local government and community).

Judging

Judging will be conducted by leaders in the community including the Supervisor of Elections who will base their scores on the following criteria:

- 1.) Creative composition and design
- 2.) Relates to the assigned theme based on grade level
- 3.) Expertise in technique and handling of media

Grades K-8 | Category 2

Instructions:
